

End-of-life challenge of paper sacks in construction industry

by 2035

all packaging materials need to be recyclable, according to the **European Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation**:

- Designed for recycling
- Recycling technologies at industrial scale in place
- Efficient collecting system in place
- Low recycling rates of packaging due to 'contamination' by building materials
- The cost for collection and the cost of logistics
- Few recyclers who can successfully recycle this packaging waste
- Lack of awareness from construction companies to recycle their waste



Piloting the collection & recycling of used paper sacks


 First circular models, focused on the used paper sacks from building sector, implemented in Spain.

 The implemented circular model includes the participation of building material producers, construction companies, specialized waste management companies and recyclers, industry associations and EPR systems.

 Used paper sacks have been successfully separated, collected, packed and recycled, which means converted into fiber and paper.

To make it happen at scale we need partners across the value chain!



Paper Sacks Go Circular Alliance:

the engagement model

- Mondi hosts first-of-its-kind round table to tackle used paper sacks from construction in November 2023 in Madrid.
- 12 industry leaders discussing how to build systems to prevent the disposal of used paper sacks.
- The circularity of paper sacks in Spain is a successful collaborative story for the whole industry.
- Eurosac and CEPI Eurokraft, decides last June to formalize this initiative under the "Paper Sacks Go Circular" Alliance.
- CoCircular is the project manager to expand and enhance the Spanish model by involving more partners and refining its approach.






From Paper Sacks Go Circular to Construction Goes Circular

Evidences that a sustainable and cost-effective solution for paper sacks could be applied to other materials.


Paper Sacks Go Circular is joining forces with other construction waste materials to scale up the collection of paper sacks, we can't do it alone!



- The paper sacks collection system in Spain allows other material waste to follow the same path.
- Higher profitability in a circular business model (economic value for the segregated material) than in a linear business model (transport and disposal).
- Re-directing EPR fees on top of the economic value of segregated materials to incentivize circularity of industrial packaging.
- The Alliance plays a key role engaging all the stakeholders of the value chain defining and implementing a circular business model that meets environmental and economic interest, while ensuring regulatory compliance.

Where is the Alliance now?

- A new economy is emerging from the recovery of construction waste, benefiting and incentivizing all parties involved.
- Over 50 companies and 170 construction sites have joined the initiative.
- Over 600 tons of paper sacks have been collected and recycled
- 2.000 tons of other waste materials have followed a similar circularity path
- 3 working groups to further improve the model:
 - Synergies and process optimization
 - Traceability and certification
 - Best practices and training
